

Installing on-line documentation on UNIX

If you installed CCD from a CD, these instructions do not apply.

These instructions are for those who download the installation files from our Web site. To keep the download time reasonable, we offer a separate installation file for the on-line documentation. This self-extracting executable file includes the documentation for all platforms.

Once you have downloaded and installed the desired version of CCD on your PC or UNIX workstation, you can add the on-line documentation anytime.

Whether installing on Windows or UNIX, the on-line documentation needs to be downloaded to Windows. Extract the files by simply double-clicking on the "CadamDocumentationJune2001.exe" self-extracting file from Explorer. A directory will be created called "CadamDocumentationJune2001". For the Windows version of CCD, you simply copy the entire contents of this directory to the Ccdraft\En_US\Help\ directory and you are done.

For UNIX, AIX or HP-UX, you must first install a browser that supports HTML formatted files. We have validated Netscape, which seems to be the most popular browser. The environment variable MOZILLA_HOME needs to be defined and set to the location of the browser. For example:

```
MOZILLA_HOME=/usr/local/netscape
```

From Windows, copy the entire contents of directory "CadamDocumentationJune2001" to the ccdraft/En_US/HELP/ directory. Since there are several subdirectories to copy, the simplest method is to use an FTP utility, such as Graphical FTP, that will automatically create the directories on UNIX for you. Be sure that binary is set before transferring the files. Directory/file access permissions should be set to allow everyone read access.

Now that the on-line documentation is installed, all you have to do from CCD is press the F1 key to display help on the current function. The user should close the Netscape window when finished reviewing the help document, because next time F1 is pressed, another copy of Netscape will be started. Furthermore, terminating CCD does not close any of the Netscape windows started by CCD.

Suggestions:

- 1 - Save the following links in Netscape to quickly get to the entire on-line documentation:

`/ccdraft/En_US/HELP/start_here.htm`
`/ccdraft/En_US/HELP/doc.htm`

- 2 - It maybe best to start Netscape with doc.htm and leave it running in the background, instead of pressing the F1 for help, which invokes a new copy of Netscape.
- 3 – Use Alt+f to quickly find/highlight keywords on the current topic.
